Day 1 - Thursday, May 8, 2014

Depart for Boston from school

Guided Sightseeing of Boston's Freedom Trail

Walk through history along this 2.5 mile trail through Boston. You will learn about the city's role in the American Revolution as you see 16 historic sites and buildings, including the 23-carat-domed State House, Paul Revere's House, the Boston Common (America's oldest park) and the Granary Burial Ground, final resting place of John Hancock, Paul Revere and Samuel Adams. When you pass by the statue of Benjamin Franklin, remember that he stands at the site of the country's first public school, Boston Latin, which is open in the Fenway area. You'll also see the U.S.S. Constitution, known as "Old Ironsides" for the way the British cannonballs bounced off her during the War of 1812. Along the way, you will have free time for lunch in Quincy Market, one of the four buildings that collectively make up Faneuil Hall Marketplace, offering a variety of foods from ice cream and cookies to seafood and ethnic cuisine.

Plimoth Plantation and the Mayflower II

History comes alive as you observe costumed Pilgrims split wood, shear sheep and prepare fish stew in a skillful re-creation of a 1627 Pilgrim village. You'll also climb aboard the Mayflower II for a tour of this full-scale reproduction of the Pilgrims' sailing vessel and explore a Wampanoag Homesite to learn about the indigenous people who have lived in southeastern New England for more than 12,000 years.
