MR. DI GRANDI'S DISSERTATION

As I continue to discuss the many different ways that students learn, I am fascinated by language. I recently read an article about the different types of words that students are exposed to throughout their learning careers. The presentation titled, "Bringing Words to Life in Kindergarten and First Grade Classrooms", by Isabel Beck mentions the different types of words students are presented with in their daily and academic lives. In summary she (and many others) describe three tiers of words. I share this with you so you can reinforce, teach, point out, and enjoy "tangling" with words like I do....

<u>Tier I - Everyday or basic words*</u> - These words rarely require direct instruction and do not have multiple meanings (book, sad, dog)

<u>Tier II - High Mileage Words*</u> - These words occur across a variety of domains and occur often in language and strongly influence speaking and reading. They may have multiple meanings and are the most important words to know because they are a good indicator of a students' progress through school (analyze, create, industrious, measure)

<u>Tier III - Content Specific Vocabulary*</u> - These words are very specific to a subject in school, a hobby, occupation, geographic region, technology, weather, etc. Students usually learn these words when a specific need arises (isotope, Revolutionary War, hypotenuse)

Make up a game; see how many you can find in a newspaper article or how many times a newscaster uses them in a night! Research states that third grade students with restricted vocabularies have declining comprehension scores.

Learning to read is the single most important activity in a child's education. Studies show that children who read at home are better prepared to succeed in formal education.

PARP is a program that asks parents to read with their children for at least fifteen minutes daily, stressing the fact that reading can be fun as well as informative. The daily activity of reading together strengthens reading and communication skills in the child and also strengthens the parent/child relationship. Note: The term 'parents' may be interpreted broadly to include all adults who play an important role in a child's life.
