Artist in Residency- Paper Marbling

Suminagashi

The development of paper marbling was originally practiced in Japan as early as the 12th century. The first forms of Japanese marbling were called Suminagashi, or ink floating on water. To create these images the artist would drop circles of ink onto water. The artist would then carefully draw intricate designs by moving the ink slowly along the water's surface. Paper was then placed on

the water and the ink would magically be transferred to the page. These images originally served to prevent forgery as no two designs were exactly the same. Students created these wonderful designs with the help of our visiting artist, Christina Di Marco.
