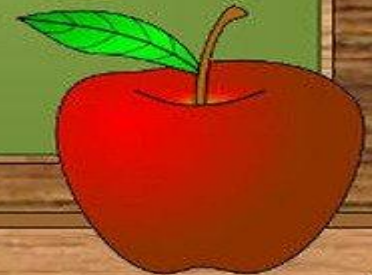
Welcome to the 2022-23 school year! It is my pleasure to be your child's ENL (English as a New Language) teacher.

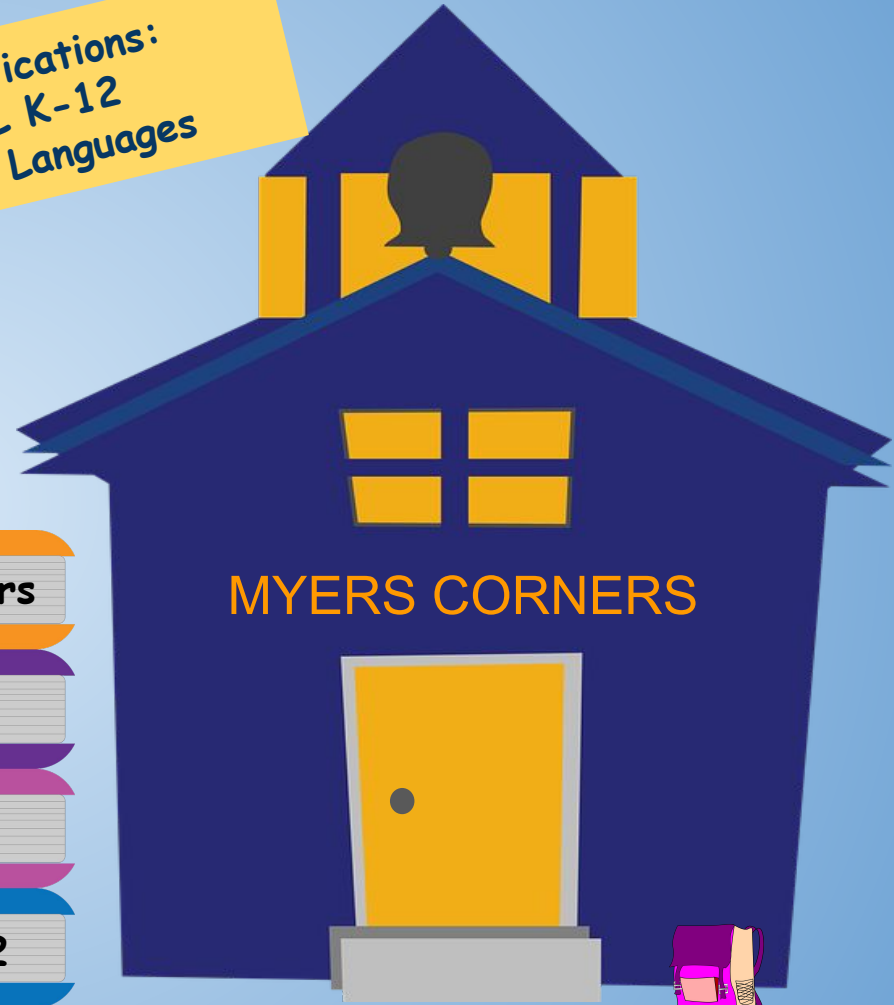
