



In the event that the road conditions require additional attention or the snow is guaranteed to stop at a later hour, the district can potentially call for a three hour delay.</p>	<p>Different Announcing Options</p> <p><u>EVENING/NIGHT BEFORE OPTION:</u> If we have the opportunity to inform families the night before due to the severity of the weather and imminent driving conditions, we will do so.</p> <p><u>MORNING of THE CANCELLATION</u> The earliest we will announce to families of a school closing will be 5:00 AM.</p> <p><u>DELAY BECOMING A SCHOOL CLOSING/CANCELLATION</u> As we monitor the conditions in the morning, we may initially call a delay. Due to the continued impact and conditions of the weather and roads, school closings may become necessary.</p>

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During the month of January many of our students will be taking Regents exams. Please encourage your child to study and be well-rested during these New York State scheduled Regents exams. We have also put in place what we refer to as “Regents Boot Camp” to provide additional assistance to your child as they prepare for their examination(s). Your school’s guidance counselor and teacher can provide information and resources available for your child.

For our students in Kindergarten through Grade 8, January marks the beginning of the administration of the i-Ready assessments. It is important that we continue to monitor the progress of our students to ensure that they are achieving academic growth. Our District has provided several workshops for parents to help them better understand i-Ready.
