As a request and a courtesy to our WCSD families, this is a special September Update Newsletter with a reminder about two items:

- · Immunization/Vaccination
- · Security Update

Immunization/Vaccination

All students are required to receive the full course of immunizations. The only allowable exemption is for valid medical reasons, which must be accompanied by a note from the child's physician stating the exact nature of the medical exemption. As of tomorrow, September 18, 2019, any student who has not started a course of immunization or submitted a medical exemption from a physician will not be able to attend school on Thursday, September 19, 2019. In addition, please refer to the Catch-up Immunization Schedule from the New York State Department of Health. If you intend to keep your child enrolled in school, the Superintendent's September Newsletter indicates what you must do to comply with the Immunization Law.

As a school district we treasure the families who have said goodbye to us and will no longer be in attendance in our schools beginning Thursday, September 19, 2019. While your child may no longer be enrolled in the District, you may have specific questions that may require further clarification.

Home Schooling

Homeschooling - also called home education or home school - is the education of children at home, typically by parents or guardians, rather than in a public or private school. Prior to the introduction of compulsory school attendance laws in the 19th century, most childhood education worldwide occurred within the family or community, with only a small portion of the population attending schools or employing tutors. Currently, the majority of children in developed nations receive their formal education at a public institution.

Homeschooling is an option for parents who wish to provide their children with a different learning environment than exists in public schools. It is also an alternative for those families who are unable, for practical or personal reasons, to comply with the regulations of a public school.

Homeschooling may refer to instruction in the home under the supervision of correspondence schools or umbrella schools. A curriculum-free philosophy of homeschooling may be called unschooling, a term coined in 1977 by American educator John Holt in his magazine Growing Without Schooling.

For many of our WCSD families who have already left our schools and/or will not be in attendance on Thursday, September 19, 2019, we wish you continued success and understand that this not only about homeschooling your student but about wanting to provide your child with the best opportunities for success.

Security

You also received information regarding our Security Vestibules. Please note that they are all on their way to completion. We want to reassure all families that while these are being completed, our schools still maintain a one-way entry (single point of access). The front doors at all schools remain locked and the same practice is still being implemented to allow for parents and visitors to enter our school buildings.

We have had questions wondering if the front doors have been compromised. Please understand that by no means have they been compromised. Our school monitors and security staff continue to follow protocol and ensure that if a person does not have valid ID, they are not able to enter into the building.

Once the security vestibules at the schools have been fully completed, we will be sure to share this information with you as well as information about protocols that will have to change slightly from our current practices.

We are grateful for all of the work that continues to happen for the safety of our schools through the Smart Schools Bond Act, the Capital Improvement Committee, and the District-wide and School Safety/Security Teams.
