
## The Dangers of Vaping

## FAQs About E-Cigarettes

- E-cigarettes contain nicotine which is highly addictive
- A single JUUL pod contains as much nicotine as a pack of 20 regular cigarettes
- Nicotine can harm brain development which continues until about age 25
- E-cigarettes can be shaped like a USB
- Use of tobacco products- including e-cigarettes is UNSAFE for young people
- 20.8% of HS and 4.9% of JHS students use e-cigarettes
- More than 3.6 million middle and high school students used e-cigarettes in the past 30 days
- E-cigarettes contain heavy metals, volatile organic compounds and ultrafine particles that can be inhaled deeply into the lungs
