Welcome to Economics. Economics is a ½ year course. Students will complete a final project at the end of the course in June. Economics supports a students' ability to earn the Seal of Civic Readiness (SOCR). The SOCR is both a graduation distinction, an honor earned above graduation requirements, and a graduation pathway as it can replace one of the 5 regents exams required to graduate. Earning the SOCR is an option for all students. All course material and projects are required in order to pass the class. Some of the coursework can earn the student points towards earning the SOCR if they meet the necessary requirements. More information will be shared on this throughout the course as the opportunity to earn points towards the SOCR arises.

Classroom Rules:

- 2. Be prepared and be an active participant in class. Bring your Chromebook/Laptop fully charged to class EVERYDAY.

100 Points or More--- Projects and Assignments 20-50 Points--- Classwork, Shorter Assignments, Asynchronous Work

Grades will be based on total points per marking period.

Assignments/Asynchronous Work: Assignments will be assigned on a regular basis and checked on the day it is due. Late assignments will be accepted the next day for 10 points off. Late essays and projects will be accepted with 10 points deducted per day. If you were absent on the day the assignment was assigned or checked, it is the student's responsibility to get the assignment and show the teacher the completed assignment the next school day.

<u>Classwork and Participation:</u> We will be keeping track of participation and classwork activities which will go toward your quarter's average.

Grading: Marking Period #3 is 50% of the final grade. Marking Period #4 is 50% of the final grade. The final project which is the post assessment will be part of Marking Period #4.
