

Exploring Visual Basic

Change the text property of your Form to **Coding Practice**

Layout

Set **Text** to Coding Practice

Create a label

Layout, change **AutoSize** to FALSE

Set **Size** to **150,50**

Set **Text** property to blank

Design

Set **(Name)** to **lblGreeting**

Create two buttons

Design

Set **(Name)** to **btnHello**

Set **(Name)** to **btnGoodbye**

Layout

Set **Text** property to **Hello**

Set **Text** property to **Goodbye**

Double click on the Hello button and type in the following code:

```
lblGreeting.Text = "Hello John Jay"
```

Double click on the Goodbye button and type in the following code:

```
lblGreeting.Text = "Goodbye America"
```

Double click on the Hello button and add the following line of code:

```
btnHello.BackColor = Color.Red
```

Double click on the Goodbye button and add the following line of code:

```
lblGreeting.ForeColor = Color.Red
```

```
lblGreeting.BackColor = Color.Yellow
```

Adjust the properties for the label

Appearance to increase font size and make bold (**font**), center the text (**text align**)

Make additional changes through the Properties window or the coding screen.

Add additional button or label to the form.
