Keys to Success

Act in a respectful manner

Be respectful of each other at all times. This includes coming to class each day prepared and on time.

Be accountable and stay on top of your work

You will be held accountable for your actions and/or inactions. Math is sequential in nature. If you allow yourself to fall behind, you will hinder your ability to understand future material.

Get to class and be an active participant in all learning activities

You place yourself at a decided disadvantage whenever you miss class. You're responsible for finding out the work you missed due to an absence. While in class, stayed focused and avoid distractions - **turn your cell phone off**. You will not be successful by simply sitting and being a passive observer in class – you need to be an active participant in your education.

Complete your homework and study your notes

Homework is designed to reinforce the day's lesson. Practice what you're taught - the more you do, the better you will get. Read through your definitions and theorems on a nightly basis. Proper vocabulary and terminology is very important throughout the course.

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Evaluation

The quarterly grade is calculated by dividing the total number of points earned by the total possible points. Anything graded throughout the quarter (tests, quizzes, homework and class work assignments) will be included in the grade. You can calculate your grade at any time using the information you will record on your *Test and Quiz Log Sheet*. The log sheet will be the first page of the *Tests and Quizzes* section of your notebook. All grades will be viewable through the Parent Portal.

Notebook

You are required to maintain a 3-ringed binder **divided into two sections** (dividers must be used to separate the sections):

1.) Test and Quiz Section

The first page will be the *Test and Quiz Log Sheet* followed by all tests and quizzes in chronological order.

2.) Notes and Handout Section

Your daily notes and all handouts should be kept in this section.

<u>Absences</u>

Homework will be assigned each night and will be checked the following day for completion. Homework will be randomly collected and graded. These graded assignments will count toward your quarterly grade. Late homework will not be accepted. Periodic email notifications will be sent home notifying parents of their son's/daughter's failure to complete the previous night's assignment. Lunch detention will be assigned if non-completion of homework becomes habitual.

Students are required to have a 3-ringed binder, a compass, a ruler along with an ample supply of graph paper. Students should also have pencils, pens (blue or black), and a scientific calculator (a graphing calculator is *not required*).
