#### **\*\*\*INTERSCHOLASTIC SPORTS INFORMATION\*\*\***

#### -FOR 6TH GRADERS-

Next Fall, as a 7th grader, your child will have the opportunity to try out for interscholastic sports at Wappingers Junior High. Interscholastic sports are school sponsored team sports that compete against teams from other schools in the area. In order to try out, there is a process that needs to be completed.

1. You must complete and sign a "Health History" form and an "Interscholastic Athletic Consent" form. These forms are currently available in the Evans Health Office and on line for printing.

-Only one "Health History" needs to be completed per year (per physical) -One "Interscholastic Athletic Consent" form needs to be completed for **each sport, each season** 

These forms should be completed and submitted to the Evans Health Office as soon as possible. Due to the large number of students interested in interscholastic sports, if there is a chance that your child will want to try out for a Fall sport at the Junior High, even if they aren't sure which sport they might want to try out for, it is advisable that you complete and submit the paper work to the Evans Health Office as soon as possible.

2. Your child will need an athletic physical examination.

This can be done in the Evans Health Office by the district physician this Spring. It would be done during school hours and there is no charge. There is no blood work or other lab work associated with an in-school physical and the children are fully clothed during this exam. You may be present with your child for this exam upon request.

The physical may also be completed at a Healthquest office:

LaGrangeville- 1100 Rt. 55 Phone (845) 485-4455

It is recommended that you make an appointment if you choose to go to Healthquest directly.

An athletic physical is valid for 12 months.
