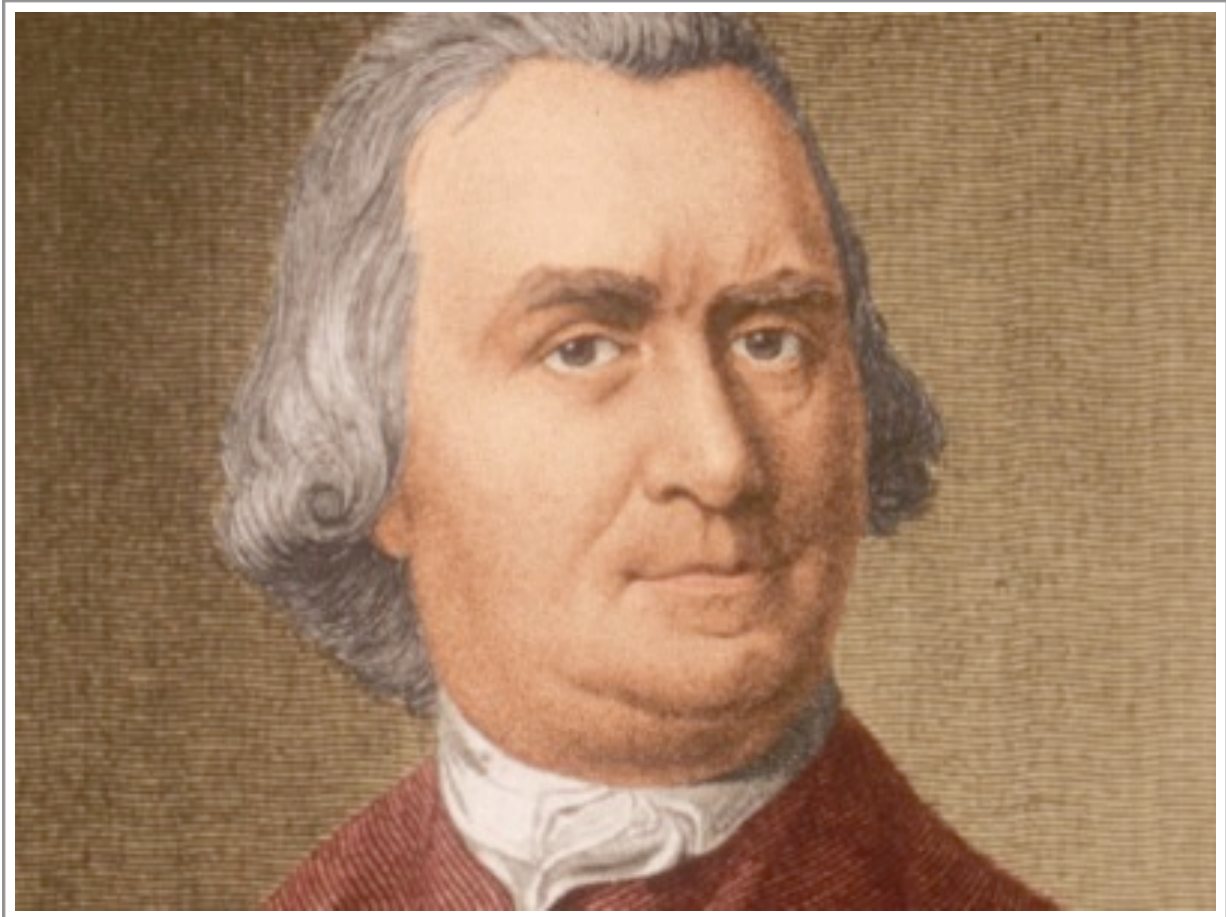

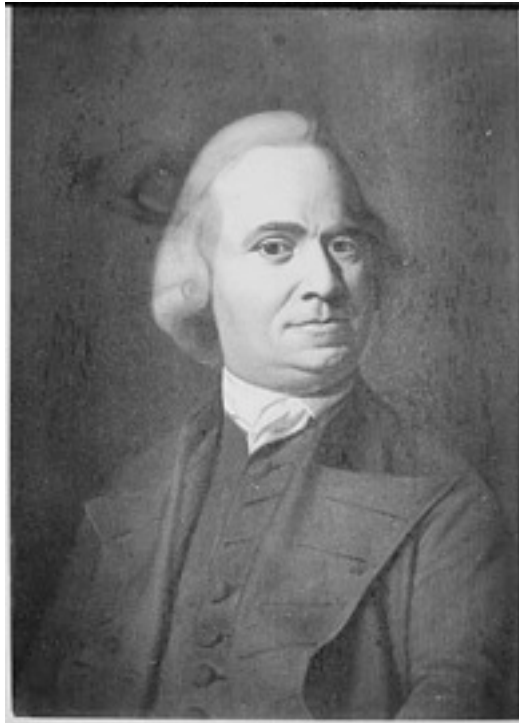

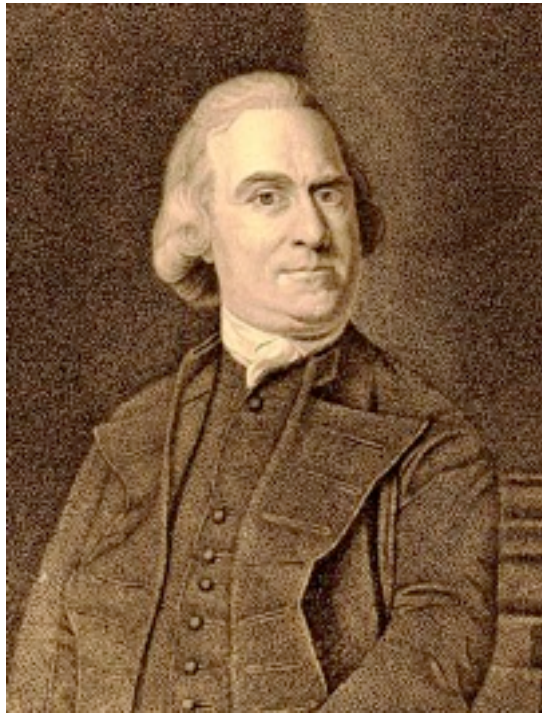
Chapter 1
