Capital Improvement Committee Meeting Summary March 1, 2017

Phil Zemke of Rhinebeck Architecture

- 2016 Capital Projects
 - ➤ Phil Zemke reviewed the scope, schedule and budget for both Phase I and Phase II.
 - Most of the discussion was regarding the new athletic fields.
 - ➤ The Capital Committee had many questions regarding the schedule of the site work for the athletic fields.
 - Questions:
 - Are lights being installed at RCK?
 - Yes, LED lights will be installed. The district is working with Central Hudson on an easement.
 - Are the wires underground or on poles?
 - The wires are presently on poles until the school fields; then wires go underground. The poles will be replaced with larger poles to adapt to the 3-phase; Central Hudson is working on an easement.
 - Why can't John Jay lights be fixed?
 - The poles at John Jay are very old, new poles will have all parts accessible inside.
 - What needs to be done to change lights?
 - o The lights will come in a strip; the strip of lights is then replaced.
 - Do you need to change the entire fixture?
 - o No
 - What is the cost to replace each field light?
 - We are not aware of replacement cost as of now
 - For the lights, do we need to worry about FAA Compliance?
 - o Lights are directed downward; poles are about 80' high.
 - How does the installation of new fields affect the track?
 - o A bridge is designed in the specs to access the track.
 - Why is the track team being kicked off their field?
 - o Athletic Directors weren't available for comment.
 - Are we running track meets?
 - o Athletic Directors weren't available for comment.
 - Is it possible to postpone work for spring track till the end of May?
 - o Ron will have another meeting with Michelle Caldwell and the Athletic Directors.
 - What is the plan for John Jay parking lot?
 - o Patch for now, complete replacement in summer of 2018.
 - Is there a warranty on the parking lot?
 - Yes, there is a 1 year warranty.
 - How long do you need to wait to paint the lines on the parking lot?
 - o Usually 1 week to 10 days.
 - Did you look into permeable pavement?
 - o Permeable pavement can't be sealed.
 - Will the drainage overload the new drywells at the schools?
 - o No

➤ The Capital Committee made a request that the Athletic Field project dates scheduled for April 24th to August 11th change to begin May 20th and end date of September 10th.

- > Air conditioners for server rooms are on hold

Other Projects

District Wide Carbon Monoxide Detectors

- Project is being wrapped up
- Ron will be meeting with each school principal and head custodian to review procedures.
- A list of contacts that include Daren, Ron and the full maintenance staff has been given to the TBS Controls.
- Question: When the CO Detectors go off, do they keep going off?
 - Yes, the gas shut off contractor will be doing a presentation.

➤ John Jay High School Water/Sewer System Improvements

- WCSD and the Town of East Fishkill need an agreement; we are getting prices from the contractor.
- Sewer line is going live in July; waiting to hear from
 - Ouestion: Is the water tested for lead?
 - Yes, the water is tested before it enters the building.
 - Question: Will we be guaranteed lead free water?
 - o Yes, the water is tested before it enters the building.
 - Question: What are our requirements for lead?
 - Suggest that water testing is done before water comes into the building.
- Ron commented that the current raw water from the well lead tests at 12ppb. The water is extremely hard which is ruining the plumbing fixtures.

> Roy C. Ketcham Press Box/Concession Stand

- Will be used for videotaping games, school paper and a concession stand.
- General Contractor is not working as planned.
- Foundation is in and up to grade; plumbing is done.
- The sewer force main piping is set
- The utilities are being run; they plan to continue during good weather until April.
- The building is fabricated.

Athletic Fields

- The district has chosen a green coated crumb rubber; it stays 10-15° cooler in the summer. The district wants to ensure the safety of the children.
- Ron shared a Turf Report and a Q&A from the EPA; Peggy Kelland shared a report on the Federal Probe of the Safety of Crumb Rubber.
 - **Question**: What has to be done to clean and maintain new turf fields?
 - Ron Broas will have the grounds crew trained to maintain them.
- RFP Update
 - **Question**: Where are we with the RFP?
 - April 19th is the bid opening
 - April 7th is the pre-bid RFP Meeting.
 - Advertisement will go out this week.
 - In the RFP, the contractors would evaluate the buildings, provide a list of what you can do and measure the savings.
