Phil Zemke of Rhinebeck Architecture

- Updated the committee on the status of the projects:
 - ➤ Contractor, Turco Golf will be adding soil support growth of the turf; this will be done over the next couple of weeks. They are responsible for the sod to become established.
 - The review by Pella of the hard to open window replacements at Wappingers Junior High is wrapping up; they have made progress of improving the ease of opening the windows.
 - ➤ Tilcon will start fixing the site paving work; they paved beyond the prepared base. The work will be on their dime except for the change orders. Saturday they will be doing surveying. Ron had the WCSD Attorney send a letter to Tilcon's bonding company. Our Engineer will be doing core testing for overlayment and for sidewalks. The concrete sidewalk argument is less than half of the sidewalks are ruined; the contractor is blaming it on the salt.
 - ➤ Phase II
 - ➤ The third party review by Tetra Tech was completed on April 20th and sent up to SED on April 23rd. There were additional comments on questioning the design load for the auditorium. SED requested the design to be based on how many people you can fit in the auditorium, not on the maximum capacity; comment hasn't been given yet. The project is out to bid, there was a prebid walk through yesterday.
 - ➤ The Smart School Bond is still on hold, despite requests of our local New York State Assemblyman; the paperwork is still sitting in Albany.
 - > John Jay water and sewer is completely except for decommissioning.
- Daren Lolkema has put together a proposal for a generator to back-up air conditioning at John Jay, and Roy C. Ketcham's server rooms.
