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School-Level Financial Reporting

- NYS school districts must report school-level financial information beginning as early as 2018
 - ESSA: 2018-19 school level actual spending due December 2019
 - Education Law 3614: school level budget reporting
 - First reporting by 76 school districts was due 8/31/18
 - 306 school districts to report for 2019-20 school year budget (actual due date TBA)
- A seismic shift in school finance
- Data transparency leverages action at all levels and among diverse parties to improve equity for students
 - Cross functional collaboration



School Level Financial Reporting

Federal Requirement (ESSA)

- Reporting school-level spending data
- · Tied to Federal Aid
- Due December 31, 2019 (annually)
- Applies to all school districts beginning in 2018-19
- The following are excluded from the expenditures:
 - · Community services
 - Capital outlay (e.g., purchases of land, school construction, and equipment)
 - Debt service (34 C.F.R. § 200.35(c)(1)).
- No guidance yet

State Requirement (3614)

- Reporting school-level budget data
- Tied to State Aid increase
- Due July 1, 2018 (annually)
- Must include "uniform decision rules regarding allocation of centralized spending to individual schools from all funding sources"
- Requirement phased in:
 - In 2018-19 to districts with at least 4 buildings receiving at least 50% of total revenue from State Aid
 - In 2019-20 to districts with at least 4 buildings
 - In 2020-21 to all other districts
- Guidance issued by NYS Division of the Budget



Data Validation

- Review to ensure consistency and completeness across the form
- Questions marked "Fail" indicate corresponding data should be revised
- Each question must be marked "Pass" when submitted

1. Is the General Fund the largest fund?

Checks *Part A from section I* to ensure the General Fund is the largest reported major operating fund.

2. Do the separately reported enrollment totals match?

Enrollment is captured at two levels in the form: district level & school-site level. This ensures all pupils reported in *Part A, section II* are accounted for at the school level in *Part B, columns K-M*.

3. Do the reported school allocations match?

Ensures that the two different breakdowns in school-level allocations in Part C (by purpose and by object) report the same total amount of funds.

4. Do the separately reported funding totals match?

Checks to see if total allocation w/central district costs in *Part C, column W* matches total funding allocated to individual schools in *Part A, section II*. The amount of funding that should be attributable at the school level is the total amount of funding identified in *Part A, section II-A* less the exclusions identified in *Part A, section 11-B and C*.



Data Validation

5. Are estimated employee benefits less than reported salaries?

Ensures column F in Part C doesn't exceed the sum of the salaries in Part C, columns D-E

6. Do the separately reported prekindergarten enrollment totals match?

Pre-k enrollment is captured in both Parts B (column L) and D (column J). Should equal

7. Do the separately reported prekindergarten funding totals match?

Pre-k total funding is captured in both Parts C (column K) and D (column N). Should equal

8. Are total employee benefits for active employees fully allocated?

Total employee benefits allocated district-wide is accounted for by various sections of the form. The sum of the 3 employee benefits lines of Part A and the total of the employee benefits column in Part C should match the total reported in *Part A*, section *IV* (excluding OPEB).

9. Was the district average fringe rate used to estimate employee benefits?

Calculates the dividend of employee benefits (part C, column F) and the sum of the salary columns (Part C, columns D and E). The dividend should match the District Average Fringe Rate (Part A, section IV).
