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Course Description

Welcome to 8th grade English language arts (ELA)! This year you will all face many academic and social challenges. We will use the New York State Common Core standards as guidelines to help improve your reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills. The goal of this course is to prepare you for high school. Therefore, you will be reading various forms of literature, including books, short stories, poems, articles, and plays. Additionally, you will learn about and complete many writing assignments including, essays, poems, projects, and letters.

Grading

You will earn grades based on your reading and writing classwork, assessments, papers, and projects. Your grades are all based on a total points system.

If You Are Absent

If you are absent it is up to you to read over the lesson that will be posted in Google Classroom and complete the assignment for the day <u>ON YOUR OWN</u>. All work is due the day after you return to class.

Independent Reading

In this class you will ALWAYS be reading an independent reading book of your choice. This book should be carried with you from class to class each day. Yes, that means you should have it in math! You will be spending a minimum of 50 minutes a week reading this book IN class and a minimum of 40 minutes a week reading OUTSIDE of class. Most work you do in ELA will require you to use your independent reading book to complete the task. In addition to the assignments I will monitor your progress during one on one and small group conferences!

Daily Procedures

Each day what we do in class will be different, but the schedule of the period will remain the same.

Do Now: Every day when you enter the room a Do Now will be posted on the board. You are expected to enter the room, complete the Do Now, & then sit quietly & wait for instructions.

Mini-Lesson: Most days I will spend the next 5-10 minutes teaching a lesson on the skill, concept, or topic you will be focusing on that day.

Class Work: During this time you will complete a task (most often using your independent reading book) based on the lesson taught that day.

Conferencing: While you are doing classwork I will be conferencing with students one on one or in small groups to help improve your reading & writing skills.

Wrap Up: To end the period we will come back together as a group and spend 1-3 minutes reviewing the material covered during the period or clearing up any confusion you may have.

Behavior

All students are expected to be both physically and mentally prepared for class. In order to make ELA a fun and successful learning environment, students need to follow the following rules:
