Mad Science: NASA: Journey into Outer Space

Campers start in the earth's atmosphere and end up in the stars in this super sampler of space science. This voyage of discovery will explore planets, moons, comets & other phenomena in our solar system. Come investigate our sun along with other stars & the galaxies they form. Build a Mad Science rocket & then design, build, and launch your own version. Learn about the challenges of living in space and then undergo astronaut training. Work with lenses and build a telescope. Discover technologies developed for use in outer space while navigating a laser maze. Campers will have lots of projects to make & take home including two rockets, a space copter, meteorological station, star chart & telescope. Learn about simple machines, gear structure, gear ratios, battery wiring, motor principles, and electronic circuits. Experiment with different forms of locomotion, including wheels, legs, "tracks" and even wind-powered walking machines. They will examine clues, get hot-on-the-trail of a culprit, and then connect the dots using science to help solve a crime in a hands-on investigation. From edible messages and decoding clues, students will have the opportunity to check out some of the skills that spies must master as they journey into the world of espionage. Take-home projects include a ultra-violet Fingerprint Finder kit, Spyglasses that let you secretly watch people who are behind you, Spy-noculars, a Secret Code Breaker, and an Inspecti-kit for evidence collection.
