Wappinger resident organizes drive to help Kentucky flood victims

Dutchess County residents pitched in to assist residents of Kentucky who lost everything from the devastating flooding that occurred earlier this summer. The floodwaters wiped out houses and businesses in the Bluegrass State. According to reports, the flooding caused at least 93 deaths.

Joe Torres, a resident of the Town of Wappinger, recently organized "Backpacks + For Kentucky," which was a school supply drive for students in Kentucky.

"I was watching news reports of the devastation. I saw at least three school buses turned over and lying among the debris. I immediately thought of the kids who would not be able to attend school because of lack of buses, among other things. Initially, I wanted to lead a caravan of other school bus drivers willing to spend a week or two filling in while the Kentucky drivers try to recover, but liability and other issues got in the way of that. So, I started a collection drive instead and first contacted the Kentucky Governor's Office on July 29th," explained Torres, via email.

Among the items that could be donated were backpacks filled with school supplies, children's books, toys, bottled water, snacks, canned goods and clothing and toiletries for children and adults.

The collections were taken up at the East Fishkill Town Hall, on Route 376 in Hopewell Junction, on Aug. 23 and Aug. 24. Volunteers also were at the Wappinger Town Hall on Aug. 25 and Aug. 26 collecting items.

The drives were sponsored by Total Transportation, which is a division of MAT Corp.

"When I came up with the idea, I sent

a proposal to Total Transportation Regional Manager Vincent Marzella. He responded that the bus company would support the effort by making available as many buses as would be needed,' responded Torres when asked whom he would like to thank. "Also, Town of East Fishkill Councilman Anil "A.J." Beephan, Town Supervisor Nicholas D'Alessandro, and Wappinger Town Supervisor Dick Thurston for posting the flyer on their respective Town Facebook pages and allowing me to use their parking lots as a collection site."

Torres noted, "Though I had an idea of creating a flyer, Angela Cavaretta of AC Vinyl Designs, designed and created the flyer within a couple of hours." He also thanked "everyone who either donated, helped promote, or otherwise supported this relief effort has my ultimate gratitude and appreciation.'

As for the message he hopes the Kentucky students and their families receive along with the backpacks, Torres said, "You are not alone. We are one people and we want to help. We have you in our prayers."

school supplies to make sure they have every necessary item, Wilson is looking over the curriculum and making lesson plans for the coming school year.


The Social Studies unit in the fourth grade is all about New York state and Colonial history, said Wilson, which interested him when

Getting ready for the last year of teaching before retirement

The 2022-23 school year will be Mead's scheduled last year of teaching in the WCSD before retiring. Mead has more than 20 years of experience as a teacher in the district.

"I actually started out as a teaching assistant. I was married with two children (at the time)," recalled Mead. She began as a teaching assistant at Gayhead Elementary School in the WCSD.

When she was the mother of three children, Mead applied for her master's degree and took all the required state exams to be certified as a teacher.

Mead currently teaches at Wappingers Junior High School (WJHS).

Asked why she went into the teaching field and what she enjoys about teaching junior high school students, Meade replied, "I just like kids in general. Junior high kids don't have a filter. They share."

As for teaching computer integration classes, where students learn about Gmail, Google Docs and more, Mead said, "It's the real world – something that they need to know. It also keeps changing and evolving."

Asked why she decided this would be a good time to retire, Mead noted, "My husband is already retired" and they want to enjoy retirement while they can. She also said she began her career later, which was when her children were all in school.

"I do enjoy the kids and my coworkers, the superintendent, our custodians, the administrators. I won't miss the grading and stuff but the people," said Mead.

Mead and her family have been residents of the district for 35 years, she said and the WCSD administration and staff "care about their kids. They get a great education." Mead mentioned her youngest child is a teacher in the WCSD, too. She also noted, "My grandson is entering kindergarten at Myers (Corners Elementary School). My son wanted his son to get the same education he had," said Mead.

As for the future, Mead said, "I just hope the district continues to be the best."

Ryan wins special election, primary

Ulster County Executive Pat Ryan (D, WOR) prevailed over Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro (R, C) in the special election on Aug. 23 to fill the Congressional District 19 (CD-19) seat left vacant when former Rep. Antonio Delgado was appointed Lieutenant Governor. Ryan took 51.07 percent of the vote, with Molinaro garnering 48.75 percent.

Results were unofficial with all districts reporting.

Ryan will serve as District 19's representative in Washington through Dec. 31. He also won the Democratic primary for the new Congressional District 18, overwhelmingly defeating opponents Aisha Mills and Moses Mugulusi.

There was low turnout for this special election, with overall participation at about 28 percent of what the NYS Board of Elections calls "active registered voters" in the district. The current 19th Congressional district includes all of the following counties: Columbia, Delaware, Greene, Otsego, Schoharie, Sullivan and Ulster; and parts of Broome, Dutchess, Montgomery and Rensselaer.

In the Nov. 8 General Election, Ryan will face off against Colin Schmitt (R, C) in this new district, which includes all of Dutchess County and parts of Ulster and Orange counties.

"Choice was on the ballot. Freedom was on the ballot, and tonight choice and freedom won," Ryan posted on his candidate Facebook page. "We voted like our democracy was on the line because it is. We upended everything we thought we knew about politics and did it together."

He added: "NY-19, it will be my honor to serve you in Congress."

Molinaro issued a statement commenting on the result.

"While this is not the outcome we hoped for, we knew this was an uphill battle when Democrats scheduled this special election on the same day as two Democratic Primaries with five candidates pushing their turnout," he said.

Molinaro will also be on the ballot in November, as the Republican candidate in the new Congressional District 19, which tracks north and west of Dutchess. His Democratic challenger will be Josh Riley, who won his primary against Jamie Cheney with nearly 62 percent of the vote.

"As we look forward, every midterm election is a referendum on the party in power. ... Everyone in this district, in America, deserves a government that respects and serves them," Molinaro stated. "In November, help is on the way as I'll be running in a new district, with a new opponent - and we will continue to offer solutions for all families in Upstate New York."

Jet ski accident on Hudson River

The New Hamburg Fire Department was dispatched on August 24 for an accident involving a jet ski on the Hudson River. City of Poughkeepsie and Middle Hope Boat were dispatched under the Hudson River Boat Plan.

According to a post on the New Hamburg Fire Department Facebook page from its chief, upon arrival New Hamburg personnel under direction of Asst. Chief Moore located two patients in the water with two heavily damaged jet skis. The victims were removed from the water and treated by two New Hamburg EMTs. The patients were brought to the gas dock at White's Marina and patient care turned over to Mobile Life.

According to the post, both patients were transported to MidHudson Regional Hospital. The Jet Skis were secured until they were brought back to shore by officials with the Command Post at White's Marina.

Bridge replacement on Washington Ave. in Fishkill

The Dutchess County Department of Public Works (DPW) has announced work to replace a bridge on Washington Avenue in the Town of Fishkill is expected to begin on or about September 6th. The bridge, located over the Fishkill Creek at the intersection of Maple Street and Petticoat Lane, will be replaced to ensure the safety and stability of the bridge and roadway for motorists.

Project work will involve replacing the structure with a new, wider bridge that will include sidewalks on both sides. The new bridge will be built adjacent to the existing structure, allowing the current bridge and roadway to remain open during construction, however there will be occasional single-lane traffic patterns over the course of the project. The new bridge is expected to open to traffic in the summer of 2023.

Motorists are advised to plan for additional time and to exercise extra caution near the construction site, obey the posted speed limits, traffic advisory signs, and the directions from flaggers in the work zone to ensure the safety of workers and other motorists.

Notes from the Town of Wappinger Supervisor Wappinger's Comprehensive Plan Part V: The Future is Now

Greetings residents, first, may you have a wonderful Labor Day weekend.

Before closing my five-part discussion on the Town's Comprehensive Plan, I remind our readers of our request for voluntary water conservation efforts. Because we are experiencing an extended dry spell, our area is now under a **Drought Watch.** Therefore, I and the Town Board are asking all residents, businesses, and other organizations to practice a number of conservation efforts. Please find more specific information and guidance on our Town's Facebook page and our website at:https://townofwappingerny.gov/blog/a-message-fromsupervisor-thurston-regarding-waterconservation/

With respect to the Town of Wappinger's Comprehensive Plan (the Plan"), as discussed in my past 4 articles, following are the salient points:

• New York's Town Law, Sections 263 and 272-a, mandate the Town Board to implement "a town comprehensive plan" and to review the comprehensive plan according to the schedule required by such plan.

• The Town Board adopted Wappinger's Plan on September 27, 2010, after many years of exhaustive analysis, public surveys and public hearings. And, the Plan requires review 'at least once every five years.

• The Town Board has never reviewed the Plan since 2010. In this my 5th year in office, I am proposing the Town of Wappinger to undertake this mandated review.

• In past issues of the *Southern Dutchess News* I have stressed the need to follow the Plan's proposals to:

follow the Plan's proposals to: - Create sustainable economic development and redevelopment along our commercial corridors and hamlet commercial districts (simply adding more car dealerships is not the solution);

- Protect the sources of both our public and private water supply (partially in process),

- Close non-compliant sewer plants and expanding the pipeline infrastructure for Town water and sewage (in process);

- Mitigate against future flooding within the Town, not just along our creek and river corridors, but also originating from our oversaturated wetlands (Under study. My effort to report out on the Wappinger I wanted to report out on one initiative but was blocked at the last Board meeting);

- Preserve and enhance our public open spaces, including our parks, Greenway trails, waterfront corridors (being addressed partially);

(being addressed partially); - Address the growing need for affordable housing for our working professionals (most especially our Covid heroes), our children and most especially for our elderly residents (the Plan calls for

both high and medium density housing); and to

- Revise the Town Code provisions affecting the above identified priorities.

Why is it now more important than ever to review the Town's Comprehensive plan as required by law? Simply:

- Our seniors, veterans, and many residents suffer from little if any discretionary income with no hope for cheaper housing into which to move. we must build more medium and highdensity housing.

- Our adult children cannot rely on future income gains off-setting the projected inflationary increases. How can they raise a family let alone eventually retire in a stagnant Town of Wappinger of potentially declining local business, absence of affordable housing, and potentially rising taxes? We must provide more opportunities, including affordable housing.

housing. - The lack of a vibrant younger local work force (number-wise) blocks local economic growth and hollows-out the availability of volunteers for first responder services. Without local opportunities for more meaningful and productive jobs, we will not keep our youth within Wappinger and we will not attract to Wappinger more young couples and families.

- The temporary population growth of the past two years may dissipate. Why, because there is neither any new major economic redevelopment in Wappinger nor new affordable housing for our workforce residents with incomes between \$35,000 and \$100,000.

Therefore, we must move forward with either a clear commitment to implement the Town's 2010 Comprehensive Plan. Or else, we must either amend the Plan or create a new one. Regardless, these actions require a strong, unwavering commitment and resolve to review the current plan as required by law. This process is what I attempted unsuccessfully to commence at the last meeting of the Town Board.

rides, and of course, both tethered balloon rides and full hot-air balloon flights! Inclusive family activities include a walkabout balloon, barrel pong, corn hole, giant Jenga, can jam, bocce, ladder ball, giant chess, washer toss, giant connect 4, yard dice, a bubble zone, and more! Live music will be played each evening from 3-8pm, this year featuring musicians Jordan Stoner, Lucky House, and Seven Days Gone.

Tymor Park treats spectators to a 360degree view of the balloons, and gives the crowd the opportunity to watch the balloons inflate up close, and to see the balloon crews in action. Live pilot presentations, "All About Ballooning," will take place each afternoon at 4 p.m.

Activities will be available rain or shine, however, balloon launches are weather and wind-permitting and are at the sole discretion of the pilots. Hot-air balloons may only inflate and fly in acceptable conditions, and the safety of our attendees is the top priority.

Reservations to attend the festival must be made in advance on a per person basis, for a donation of \$15 per person for afternoon/evening admission, \$8 per person for morning admission, \$25.95 per person for a weekend all-access pass, and free for children under the age of 3. Donations are non-refundable and non-transferable. The reservation includes all activities except balloon rides, and is only good for one person admission on the date and time selected. Full hot-air balloon flights are \$300 per person for a 25-45minute long experience. Tethered hot-air balloon flights are \$25 per person, payable in cash only during the festival. Tickets are not sold at the gate; you must purchase them online in advance at dcroc.org/balloonfesttickets. For morning reservations, parking is at Tymor Park, 249 Duncan Road, Lagrangeville. For evening reservations, parking is at Vail Farm Elementary School, 1659 E. Noxon Road, Lagrangeville; a shuttle bus will bring you to Tymor Park, less than three miles away.

Young people learn financial, computer skills during two-day County program

Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro congratulated eight local young people who completed the Dutchess County Department of Community and Family Services' (DCFS) two-day "Youth Financial Literacy & Computer Training Program," an annual course that teaches participants valuable financial and computer skills.

DCFS again partnered with the Dutchess County Workforce Investment Board and the Dutchess One Stop to coordinate financial, computer and budgeting training for local young people, many of whose families receive services from DCFS.

The young participants began this week's intensive program by learning how to identify their skillset, then composing a résumé and cover letter to grab potential employers' attention. They also gained important computer skills, including learning the dangers and appropriate use of the Internet and social media; and they learned about financial literacy, budgeting and using formulas in Microsoft Excel through a hands-on, real-life scenario where they made budget decisions for a family of four. In addition to Excel, participants learned how to use Microsoft Word and PowerPoint to complete school assignment and projects. The participants concluded the program by learning about the Dutchess County One Stop Career and Employment Center, as well

as the available services to help them find jobs.

Molinaro said, "I'm proud of each of the young men and women who have completed the Dutchess County's Youth Financial Literacy & Computer Training Program – young people who have dedicated themselves to preparing for a successful future for themselves and their families. Dutchess County thanks its partners for their continued collaboration, make this annual program a success for the hundreds of participants who have benefited from the lessons it teaches. I congratulate each of today's graduates, and we, as a county, look forward to seeing how the skills and resources they've gained this week will result in bright futures."

Ranging in age from 13 to 18, the students were required to achieve satisfactory attendance and satisfactory grades in school to qualify for this week's program. After successfully completing the program, each participant earned a laptop computer and printer to help them follow their goals of attending college and pursuing a career.

This program has been recognized as a best practice for youth job preparation and was showcased at the 2015 summer conference of the New York Public Welfare Association. The program is funded through the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program and the Foster Care Block Grant.

Council on Addiction Prevention & Education offers prevention programs to county schools

Beginning in the 2022/2023 school year, the Council on Addiction Prevention and Education (CAPE) will offer two new prevention programs to middle and high school students of Dutchess County. The first of these is PreVenture, an evidencebased prevention program that uses personality trait-targeted interventions to promote youth mental health and skill development with the overall goal of delaying substance use. Here's the playoff situation for the HV Renegades

Once again, the Hudson Valley Renegades are in the thick of the playoff chase in minor league baseball.

The Renegades, the Class A farm tea of the New York Yankees, play in the North Division of the South Atlantic League.

Like all of minor league baseball, the 132-game season is divided into a first half and second half. Hudson Valley was barely a .500 team in the first half and finished behind Aberdeen in the vision. But Renegades caught fire in the second half and currently sit at 66-53 overall and 32-21 in the second half, a half-game ahead of Brooklyn. Both the Renegades and the Cyclones have 12 regular-season games remaining.

Now, if you're an astute baseball fan, you see right away that the math doesn't work. Well, there's where the key element could come into play. Hudson Valley technically would have 13 games remaining at this point, but it was decided that a rainout early in the season would not be made up. So, if the Renegades and Brooklyn continue this neck-and-neck run to the finish, it's possible one of the teams could finish a half-game ahead – or behind.

We know this much – the winner of the second half of the North Division will play first-half North champion Aberdeen in the South Atlantic semifinals. The series will be best 2-out-of-3. Either Hudson Valley or Brooklyn will host Game 1 before traveling to Aberdeen for Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3.

The winner of that series will play the South Division champ for the league title, also in a best-of-three series.

ROUNDUP Renegades take 5-of-6 from Hickory to stay in first place

Kyle Battle delivered a go-ahead homerun as part of a three-run seventh inning, lifting the Hudson Valley Renegades to a 9-7 victory over the Hickory Crawdads on Sunday afternoon at Dutchess Stadium.

Battle went 2-for-3 with a decisive tworun single, a double, a run scored and two stolen bases in his third game with the Renegades.

With the win, the Renegades took five of six from the Crawdads and remained a halfgame ahead of Brooklyn for first place in the North Division of the South Atlantic League (see separate story on playoff scenarios).

Hudson Valley jumped ahead in the bot-tom of the first against Hickory starter Dane Acker. With the bases loaded and one out, Carlos Narvaez lined a three-run triple and Ben Cowles lifted a sacrifice fly to give the Renegades a 4-0 lead.

The Crawdads leveled it up in the top of the fourth against Renegades starter Blane Abeyta. Daniel Mateo knocked an RBI single, Chris Seise slammed an RBI double, Cristian Inoa skied a sacrifice fly, and Cody Freeman laced an RBI single to tie the game at four.

In the top of the fourth, Mateo drew a walk with the bases loaded to push Hickory ahead 5-4. The Crawdads plated another in the top of the sixth. Josh Hatcher drilled an RBI single, scoring Angel Aponte from second to extend the lead to 6-4.

Abeyta lasted 4.2 innings, allowing six runs on nine hits, walking six and striking out three.

Hudson Valley pulled even in the bottom of the sixth with three timely doubles. Kyle Battle doubled, stole third, and Eduardo Torrealba smoked an RBI double. Trey Sweeney followed with a screaming double down the right field line, plating Torrealba to tie the game at 6-6.

In the top of the seventh, Randy Florentino floated a sacrifice fly off Edgar Barclay to give the Crawdads a 7-6 edge.

In the bottom half, the Renegades stormed back to take the lead. T.J. Rumfield, Narvaez, and Cowles walked sequentially against Michael Brewer (2-2) to load the bases. With the bases full and no one out, Sanchez grounded an RBI single and Battle stroked a two-run single to put Hudson Valley in front 9-7.

Barclay (6-4) earned the win, tossing 2.1 hitless innings of relief, allowing one unearned run, walking one and striking out two. Carlos Gomez picked up his fourth save with two scoreless innings, escaping a bases-loaded, one-out jam in the eighth, and working around a leadoff single in the ninth to secure the win.

Hudson Valley was set to begin its final regular-season homestand of the year on Tuesday, August 30 with the first of six games against Jersey Shore.

County hosts 2022 Ag Forum Youth Ag winners at the Fair at the Dutchess County Fair

Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro and Dutchess County Legislature Chair Gregg Pulver hosted the 2022 Agricultural Advisory Committee Forum at the Dutchess County Fairgrounds in Rhinebeck on Thursday, Aug. 25. They were joined by members of the Agricultural Advisory Committee, which includes local farmers, agri-business representatives, agricultural and land conservancy organizations, and others to discuss issues and policies surrounding Dutchess County agriculture and farming.

New York State Senator Sue Serino. Assemblymember Didi Barrett and County Legislators Tony D'Aquanni, Edward Hauser, Deirdre Houston and Don Sagliano joined more than 50 local farmers, elected officials and representatives from various agricultural and land conservancy organizations at today's forum. Following the forum, members of the ThinkDIFFERENTLY 4-H program for children of all abilities had the opportunity to show their animals at the Fair, where County Executive Marc Molinaro presented each a medal for their participation.

Land in agriculture comprises over 100,000 acres in Dutchess County, which is almost a fifth of the County's total acres. Accounting for nearly \$44 million in market value products, local agriculture is one of the County's primary industries. Molinaro said, "Since Dutchess

Molinaro said, County's formative days, agriculture played a pivotal role in our community's development, and hundreds of years later, farming remains critical to our county's success. Particularly in recent years, farmers have found their passion to be a challenging labor of love, and the County's Agricultural Advisory Committee continues to work tirelessly to advocate on farmers' behalf to keep our agricultural legacy

alive. We thank the committee members, and those they represent, for their efforts to ensure farming remains an integral part of Dutchess County for generations to come.'

Members and attendees listened to a presentation by Kelly Young, Director of Agricultural Development, from the NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets about opportunities for agriculture in New York State and the role of the Department in supporting farmers as a local and regional economic generator. Forum attendees also heard updates from the Dutchess County Agricultural Advisory Committee on a number of topics, including agricultural education, next year's Agricultural Districts 8-Year Review Process, and the 2022 Farming in Dutchess Virtual Series, including upcoming sessions this fall:

• New and beginning, and urban farmers, Oct. 4th, 7 p.m.

• Regenerative farming and soils health, Oct. 12th, 6:30 p.m.

• Ag value assessment and ag districts programs, Oct. 13th, 6 p.m.

• Purchase-of-development rights and conversation easements, Oct. 25th, 5 p.m.

• Agricultural education, Nov. 9th, 5 p.m. Chairman Pulver, a multi-generational

farmer in the Town of Pine Plains, said, "Farming has always been both a challenging yet rewarding endeavor, though recent nationwide factors have made it more difficult than ever for many. Our Agricultural Advisory Committee, however, remains resolute in its advocacy for Dutchess County farmers, and we are fortunate to have such a dedicated panel working on farmers' behalf, making agriculture the priority it rightly deserves to be. Regardless of the obstacle, this committee continues its honorable work to keep farming alive and well in Dutchess County.



• Amelia Coon, the nine-year-old daughter of Isaac and Amber Coon, won the 4-H Supreme Junior Championship with her Guernsey cow "Glow." This is a first for a Guernsey, which is a smaller breed known for the high vitamin content of its milk.

• Bob Jenks – make that Sargent Major Jenks – showed off the new 4-H mobile shooting range, which made its debut at this year's fair. The trailer, made possible by a grant from American Legion Post 178 and Dutchess County, is fitted for students to practice with air rifles, air pistols and archery equipment. The "George Downing Memorial Mobile Range" is dedicated to the late 4-H shotgun instructor George Downing, who was tragically killed last September by a wrong way driver as he was coming home from a 4-H competition. Sargent Major Jenks is the leader of Dutchess County Long Rifles, one of the most successful 4-H clubs, "teaching the safe ethical use and handling of firearms in any environment our kids find themselves."
