Welcome to seventh grade math!

Units to be covered this year include:

1. The Number System
2. Expressions and Equations
3. Ratios and Proportional Relationships
4. Geometry
5. Statistics and Probability



Supplies Needed:

1. Student planner (used for all classes)
2. #2 pencils
3. Marble composition or spiral notebook
4. 3 ring loose-leaf binder (to be shared with Science, ELA, & Social Studies)
5. Loose-leaf
6. Scientific calculator Texas Instrument TI-30X IIS (optional, but highly recommended)
7. Textbook provided by teacher (to stay at home for the school year)

Class Expectations:

1. Be respectful and try your best at all times

Grades:

Quarterly grades are weighted based on the four components as follows:

- Class Participation – 10%
- Homework – 20%
- Quizzes – 35%
- Tests – 35%



Homework:

Math homework will be assigned daily. It is the responsibility of the student to write down the assignment in their planner and complete the assignment each day. Assignments can also be found on Google Classroom. Homework will be based on the lesson taught in class, therefore students should refer to the textbook examples done in class and notes. Students should complete their homework the day it is assigned in preparation for the next day's lesson. Late assignments will not receive full credit. It is important that students make their best attempt to answer every homework question for full credit. The homework grade is based on the student's effort and completion of each homework assignment. Students should seek assistance when faced with difficulty on homework. Students should make corrections and ask questions while homework is being reviewed in class.

Class Participation:

Students are expected to participate during all lessons. Being prepared for class, taking notes, answering questions, and asking questions are all ways students can participate.

Quizzes:

Quizzes will evaluate student progress on specific learning objectives. Students are expected to study for each quiz and ask for any necessary extra help prior to the assessment.

Tests:

Tests will evaluate student knowledge on whole units. Students are expected to study for each test and ask for any necessary extra help prior to the assessment.

Extra Help:

Extra help is always available and scheduled based on student requests. Extra help is given during the student's study hall period or lunch period.

Absences:

Students are responsible for completing all missed work within 3 days of returning to school. Students can find the missed notes and assignments on Google Classroom.
