

University of Rochester Award Program- Minimum Scholarship awards of \$10,000 per year for qualified applicants. Students must apply to have their nomination for the award considered. Application fee to the college waived.

Bausch and Lomb Honorary Award- Established to honor a junior who excels in the sciences and has taken rigorous courses. PSAT and SAT Math scores can be considered as criteria with these courses. Nominees should also be positive contributors to their school and within the larger community. Nominee will receive certificate and medallion to be presented at award ceremony. Over the summer, the nominee will receive a letter, more information about the University of Rochester, and a fee waived application.

Frederick Douglas and Susan B. Anthony Award Established to recognize a junior with good course grades in the humanities and social sciences. Demonstrated commitment to understanding and addressing different social issues. Demonstrated leadership and dedication to community action. Students with strong grades and rigorous courses taken in the humanities and social sciences should be considered. Nominee will receive certificate and medallion to be presented at award ceremony. Over the summer, the nominee will receive a letter, more information about the University of Rochester, and a fee waived application.

George Eastman Young Leaders Award- Junior with strong leadership qualities, high grades and challenging courses. Also extensive involvement in extracurricular activities.

RIT Computing Medal-\$7,000 per year for 4 years- can pick one male and 1 female. Student is ranked in top 10% of the class, displays leadership, and an interest and ability in computing. **Nominee does not need to major in a computer related program.**

Innovation and Creativity Award Program - \$7,000 per year for 4 years-can pick one male and one female. Student is ranked in the top 10% of the class, displays leadership, and outstanding achievement in innovation, creativity and entrepreneurship.

Marist Medal of Science

Application for this award is by nomination. We can nominate up to 3 students who will complete an application and Marist will choose the winner. Candidates will have good academic standing, demonstrated strong performance in science and math classes, community service, and a high probability of meeting Marist admission standards. The award recipient will be recognized with a medal and a \$5,000 scholarship to Marist College which is renewable if the awardee majors in one of the disciplines in the School of Science, and meets the GPA requirements of the scholarship. **Typed** applications with transcripts must be sent to Marist by **April 15, 2016.** Please let your counselor know ASAP if you would like to be nominated for this scholarship.

RPI Medal

The RPI scholarship and medal recognition is now a \$25,000 per year scholarship if admitted to the college and a medal nominee. In general, the candidate should be a top Math/Science student, someone who has taken a rigorous, challenging course selection, earned the highest grades, and presented the strongest overall academic profile. The candidate must be in the top 10% of the class and accepted students must have completed Chemistry, Physics, and a minimum of 4 years of math through Pre-Calculus. In addition, they should have significant involvement in extracurricular activities.

Interest in RPI is not a specific criterion for selection.
